ZSAA Stallion Licensing

Sires for all needs

The Licensing of the ZSAA in Alsfeld ended with record-breaking results: 28 licensed stallions of all possible branches offer possibilities for almost every demand.

For the 15th time the ZSAA licensing took place in the Hessian town Alsfeld in Germany. 44 candidates were more than ever before and 28 positive decisions were unprecedented. The pre-inspection appeared worthwhile considering only a very small number of stallions seemed ob-

viously out of place. Even though Stallions were allowed to participate without any recommendation.

Eight purebred arabians participated, representing every variation from a dainty Babson-egyptian to the french racing champion. Half of them reached the required standard, three of them

being pure egyptian-bred stallions. The highest score received Cerasus Saturn, a grandson of Kubinec with more than 50 percent egyptian blood and Marbach in the dam line; as well as the Babson-egyptian Manara Faaris, who already received his HLP in Marbach 2005 with a score of 99,85. Both stallions

ons were praised for their exemplary walk, for which the 146 centimeter tall Manara Faaris even received a nine. Main gaits played an important role but not undermining the type. The Egyptian studs Mahmudi and Mahfouz Bin Mourad Al Thani, both licensed, were counted as the most characteristic out of the whole lot. The only French however failed. He could show an enormous canter but did not convince in any of the other gaits.

Strong Shagya Year

Especially pleasant was the age group of Shagya Arabians, eleven participants have last been seen in 1992. All stallions

had enough height and caliber and all with one exception were recognisable Shagya Arabian types. Five four-year-olds were licensed, among them two sons of the VZAP elite stallion Tibor. Fortunately we could also see stallions of not so common bloodlines; even one without any of the main bloodlines Gazal VII or Bajar in his pedigree. Zoltan Ibn Zela, the horse with the highest score, carries two crosses to Bajar and Balaton, but with a height of 161 centimeters he represents unmistakably an Arabian type. Besides the five youngsters three older stallions were licensed. KS Odenko and Banderas as well as the bay Hungarian import O'Bajan Nabil P with 25 percent purebred

red-blood had already been licensed at the VZAP. Small but mighty was the Anglo-Arabian group. The smallest group with only four participants but all of them were licensed or approved. The four-year-old Tigris, son of Askar, was not licensed in the previous year but showed much maturity in 2008 and reached the required standards. This group provided the only two premium stallions of this Licensing: The six-year-old Nabucco, 171 centimeters tall but characteristic stallion and the English purebred Lenz. He is 23 years old and was the oldest horse in this show, but still participated in free jumping and received the highest score.

The partbreds, which have only been part of the ZSAA for a few years, managed to grow to be the largest group now, especially the arabian Warmbloods. The branch „Partbred“ offers an ideal alternative for warmblood breeders, who use arabian blood but have problems with the licensing when their horses are less mature and smaller than the typical conspecific. For the same reason have some breeder of Trakehners found their way to the ZSAA. This breed represents the largest group of the partbreds. As soon as these studs are matured they can subsequently be approved as official Trakehners. Eight stallions were licensed, five of them were Trakehners. Three could not be

approved as partbreds, as the requirement is a minimum of 12.5 percent arabian blood; they will be put in the appendix and can sire partbreds when crossed with an adequate mare. The Trakehner breed is heavily influenced by arabians, the influence in these stallions however has been too far in the past. The rest of these stallions originate from Shagya-Arabs mated with Holsteins, Hannoverians and westfalian Warmbloods. The star - with the highest score - of the group german riding horses (Deutsches Reitpferd) was the lovely three-year-old Palomino Hokuspokus. A mix of Trakehner and Equus Kinsky with very obvious 25 percent pure arabian-blood. The

Partbreds in the category speciality horses was the least homogenous group. Paints, ponies, and arab-crosses out of every breed but warmbloods can be found here. As in the purebred group four out of eight were licensed. Three of them have already been approved elsewhere, for instance the pinto CS Shubani with 75 percent arabian blood. Newly licensed was an Achal-Tekkiner for the arasian department, a stallion with the color cremello interesting for breeding. As representative of an ‚breed of origin‘ he will be put in the appendix just like the Lewitzer stallion Shakespeare, who was licensed as well.
